Basic Maintenance - What the school can do

The main routine – Weekly? Fortnightly?

- 1. Clean out lint & check for thread jams.
- 2. Change needle.
- 3. Oil the machine's shuttle.

Session check of machine settings – Pre or Post Lesson

- 1. Tension = 4
- 2. Feed dogs raised
- 3. Machine threaded correctly
- 4. Machine set to straight stitch (if mechanical machine)
- 5. Take up lever raised (if mechanical machine)

Professional Maintenance - What we can do

1. Annual partial service

Fine tuning & preventative maintenance on stitch forming parts

2. Occasional full service

Full removal of covers and systematic preventative maintenance on all systems.

PARTIAL SERVICING ON-SITE (AT THE SCHOOL)

SEWING MACHINES: \$49 OVERLOCKERS: \$59 EMBROIDERY MACHINE: \$49*

- On-site services are a partial service only ó not full cover removal.
- Parts and on-the-spot repairs will incur additional cost.
- Repairs not able to be done onsite can be brought in to Allmake by the visiting technician for quote & repair if warranted.
- Call out fee may be applicable calculated by travel time x hourly rate \$120.00 (unless otherwise discussed, country schools to cont)

*\$49 covers a partial service to the machine only, embroidery stitch-outs or work done to an embroidery unit will incur additional cost.

- Parts and repairs will incur additional cost.
- Full services with full cover removal have a 6 month warranty.
- Partial services available at same cost as on-site listed above.
- Quotes available with a \$30 minimum charge if quote declined.

What thread should we use?

We recommend Rasant by Amann

Why?

Cheap thread is weak, uneven & porous (dry!)...

Gutermann? – not what it used to be, harsh on the machine & is very expensive

Rasant is:

- ó Strong (core-spun polyester & cotton)
- ó Consistent gauge (thickness, ie. No slubs)
- ó Lubricated (gentle on the machine)
- ó Stores well
- ó Colourfast
- ó Resilient
- ó Multi-purpose
- ó Cost-effective (\$8.20 for 1000m)

What feet are available?


With Bernina – quite a few:

Newer models take the 'White box' style of foot

- ó the full range
- ó approx 100 feet
- ó see picture on the right

Older models and the the 1xxx lineage take 'Red box'

- ó a more limited range
- ó approx 75 feet
- ó see picture on the left



1. Juki TL2010 – straight stitch \$2129

- 1500 stitches per minute
- Industrial bobbin system
- Industrial style cutter
- Knee lift
- Cutter can be operated from foot control
- Large range of feet standard equipment

Front loading or Top loading?

Front/side loading





Stable tensions, less fussed with thread quality, indestructible. (This is why industrial machines are front/side loading)

Top loading



Faster to thread up, can see bobbin level, no oiling required

Mechanical vs (basic) electronic?

Concerned about transitioning to electronic machines?

Don't be, there are many good points:

 $Take\ up\ lever\ automatically\ raised = less\ thread\ jams$

Extra stitches for no extra cost

Mechanically simpler

Technologically relevant

Auto declutch when winding bobbins

Can focus on stitching rather than setting up

Easy to reset – just turn off then on again

Reliable – electronic faults are statistically low
